LLANO – James “Jamie” Osbourn will become the new Texas Cooperative Extension agricultural and natural resources agent for Llano County effective Dec.1.

The announcement was made by Llano County Judge Wayne Bascom and Scott Durham, district Extension administrator at San Angelo.

“We are most pleased to have Jamie fill this key position in the Extension family,” said Durham. “He’s from Llano County, so he knows the Texas Hill Country area well. He’s also very familiar with Extension work, having grown up in Extension’s 4-H youth program in Llano County. I’m sure his lifetime experience with agriculture and Extension will make him a real asset to the agency on the county, district and, no doubt, state level.”

Osbourn earned a bachelor of science degree in animal science from Texas A&M University and a teaching certificate from Texas State University at San Marcus.

Prior to accepting his Extension position, Osbourn served as a vocational agricultural teacher for the Marble Falls and Blanco Independent School Districts where he taught agricultural technology.

Osbourn has served as a board member for the Texas Pork Producers Association, the Llano Livestock Show and the Llano Youth Sports Association. He has also served as a collegiate judging official and 4-H adult leader.

Osbourn fills the position vacated by Todd Swift who transferred to Blanco County.
