BRADY - Jane Holubec, Texas AgriLife Extension Service family and consumer sciences agent in McCulloch County, is being honored with a reception in Brady upon her retirement Aug. 31.

The come-and-go event will be held from 5-7 p.m. at the Brady Housing Authority Meeting Room.

“Everyone who was touched by Mrs. Holubec’s programs and service over the years is encouraged to attend the reception and let Jane know how much she has meant to them individually and to the citizens of McCulloch County,” said Vance Christie, Holubec’s coworker and AgriLife Extension agent in McCulloch County.

“Jane began her career in McCulloch County, and in what is extremely rare, spent her entire tenure working out of the AgriLife Extension office in Brady,” Christie said.

Scott Durham, Holubec’s supervisor and AgriLife Extension West Central District administrator at San Angelo, said Holubec worked tirelessly to improve the lifestyles of youth and adults of McCulloch County.

“She was very involved in the evolution of the county’s 4-H program, and can be justifiably proud of the effectiveness and success of her foods and nutrition, clothing and fashion and consumer decision-making programs that have involved hundreds of youth over her career,” Durham said.

“She has also educated scores of adults through her healthy living and consumer programs throughout her 30-year AgriLife Extension career in McCulloch County.”

Durham said her most recent efforts have included the Better Living for Texans, Do Well Be Well and Cooking Well with Diabetes programs. He said she was also instrumental and continues to be active with the Haven Shelter for women and children in McCulloch County.

Holubec and her husband Frankie live and raised their sons Chad and Cody in the Melvin Community. Both boys were active in 4-H, worked on the family’s farming and ranching operation and continue to live in McCulloch County.

The reception is being conducted by the AgriLife Extension office in McCulloch County in cooperation with the county’s 4-H Adult Leaders Association and the McCulloch County Extension Educators clubs.
