SAN ANGELO - Texas AgriLife Extension Service 4-H clubs across Texas will celebrate "One Day 4-H" on October 10 as part of National 4-H week which runs from October 4-10.

"On Saturday, 4-H club members from across the state will be going out into their communities, either with their respective club or as individuals, to perform some type of community service to commemorate our state's 'One Day 4-H' project," said Charla Bading, AgriLife Extension's West Central regional program director at San Angelo.

"One Day 4-H is a statewide effort meant to raise both the public's and the individual 4-H member's awareness of the many good works in community service that 4-H members perform," Bading said. "We're asking each member or their club to choose someone to help in some special way. It can be as simple as mowing your neighbor's lawn or whipping up a batch of brownies for a friend, but whatever it is, we want pictures taken of the 4-Hers in action in order to document the day's events."

Bading said the photos will be compiled into a DVD for use in future presentations to civic groups and for future 4-H promotional materials.

"The main thing we want to show is just how much can be accomplished in a single day when many hands work together for the betterment of one another," she said.
