The Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service recognized outstanding agents and staff earlier this month in College Station during the annual Texas A&M AgriLife Conference.

Garry Branham, AgriLife Extension program specialist for 4-H in San Angelo, was recognized with the Superior Service Award.

"I obviously do this work for positive youth development, not for awards, but this is a great honor and very much appreciated," Branham said.
