GPS Trackers Terms

- Pings/Locations Refers to a GPS position taken by the tracker, generally every 15-30 minutes. Most trackers can store thousands of pings at a time before overwriting in the unit's memory. Pings generally do not use much battery life.
- Uploads/Updates Occur at set times during the day, usually every 2-4 hours. Refers to the ping/location data being sent to the tracking providers online computer system. Uploads generally use the most battery life in a tracker.
- Geofence Imaginary line drawn around property or pastures online. Allows for notifications if the LGDs leave or enter a location. Helpful for roaming dogs. Notifications via text or email.

GPS Tracker Types

- Passive <u>iGot-U</u>
- Active Oyster, Yabby, Solarmax, Smart One C-Satellite

Passive Tracker Pros

- Small size
- Inexpensive, ~\$50
- Battery life, months to years
- No monthly fee
- Rechargeable

Passive Tracker Cons

- Require manual download of information from the unit
- No live tracking of LGDs
- Waterproof case recommended

Active Tracker Pros


- Small to medium size
- Constant tracking, virtual data uploads
- New tech constantly coming out
- Decent battery life, weeks to months
- Several options for signal service Cellular, LoRa, Satellite
- Waterproof case included
- Dogs & stock can be located for gathering

Active Tracker Cons

- Moderate initial expense, ~ \$150
- Monthly fees, \$4 \$15
- Poor cell signal reduces battery life
- More expensive batteries, Lithium Ion recommended
- False alerts often when dogs are close to geofence

Tracker Take Home Points

- Pros
 - Helpful to locate LGDs and stock from your phone or computer
 - Relatively inexpensive
 - Battery life and technology is constantly improving
- Cons
 - Must be able catch dogs to replace or charge batteries
 - False alerts of geofence departures can be annoying
 - Need to purchase new trackers as technology updates
